UCIPD received a report that a female was groped while walking on Adobe Circle Way near parking lot 29 around 11pm on Friday, November 15, 2019. The female identified a heavysset male, possibly 6 feet 2 inches tall, race is unknown, wearing a black hoody; came up behind her and used his hand to grope her breast. The female elbowed the male and ran to her apartment.

**Safety Tips:**

- Be aware of people around you. When you are walking, stay alert and tuned in to your surroundings.
- If you are being followed, go to the nearest building, office or residence for help.
- If you start to feel concerns about a person or situation, trust your feelings and try to remove yourself as quickly as possible from the potential threat, even if it is someone you know and if it feels awkward to do so.
