Report

On Sunday, February 26, 2023 UCIPD received a report that a rape took place on campus in a UCI residential community on Saturday, February 25, 2023. The survivor met the suspect on a social media dating site. The suspect was described by the survivor as a 6'1" Persian male, 180 lbs, medium brown hair, brown eyes, wearing black ripped jeans, a black sweatshirt with white writing and black shoes.

Help fight crime by reporting suspicious activity to UCIPD immediately - race, gender, and religious affiliation are not considered suspicious.

Safety Tips

- If you are going out alone, make sure that someone knows where you are going, who you will be with and when you expect to return.
- If you start to feel concerns about a person or a situation, trust your feelings and try to remove yourself as quickly as possible from the potential threat, even if it is someone whom you know and even if it feels awkward to do so.
- If you think someone is at risk of assault or abuse, you should consider it an emergency and act to support that person.
- You can call the police or ask for help from other people, intervene directly if safe, or

create a distraction to help remove the potential victim from the situation.
